A Safe Alternative: Design of PennDOT Ramp G3 Tunnel

ackin Engineering Company, of Pittsburgh, was contacted by Golden Triangle Construction Company to perform the design of the District 12 Ramp G3 Tunnel at the I-70/I-79 South Interchange. The existing 1960's dual span I-70 bridges which carried I-70 over Ramp G3 required superstructure replacement and substructure rehabilitation. Golden Triangle proposed an alternative to District 12 - construct a concrete box (tunnel) under the existing bridges, construct an embankment in the area occupied by the bridges - then remove the bridges and construct the remainder of the embankment and pavement over one weekend. Golden Triangle's proposal was accepted by District 12, and was ultimately approved by FHWA. The elimination of the bridge resulted in significant savings in traffic control costs. However, the biggest benefit was the safety of both the public and construction workers.

Key Issues

Creating a new ramp profile was very difficult. Conditions included a 5% grade of existing I-79 South, the low chord elevations of both superelevated bridges above, and a pier foundation for the new flyover ramp just north of the bridges. The new ramp profile had to be above the northern pier foundation, under the existing beams, and tie

into the existing grade to the south while providing minimum 16'-6" vertical clearance in the tunnel and superelevation transitions through the tunnel. To meet these con-



straints, the roof of the tunnel was sloped to match the grade of the existing bridges, the ramp roadway was placed with a vertical sag curve through the tunnel, and the tunnel structure was constructed on a different sag curve alignment to accommodate the roadway and maintain constant wall heights.

Horizontally, the section of the ramp proposed for the box tunnel was located between reverse horizontal curves. The original bridges were built to accommodate a 44' median between the ramps which set the piers far enough apart to provide 37'-10~%" between foundations. The ramp and tunnel walls required a width of 37'-8", slightly less than the available 37'-10~%".

Another concern was settlement. Earth, Inc. provided geotechnical analysis and recommendations. A layer of dark, organic soil was identified between fill material placed during construction of the original I-70 and bed-



rock. It was estimated that up to 5" of settlement would occur at the southern end of the tunnel with the northern portion of the tunnel on bedrock. Preloading of the tun-

nel area, and the approach span area after construction of the tunnel, reduced settlement to 1" or less.

District 12-0 was highly pleased with the tunnel project as evidenced by this quote from District Executive Joe Szczur in the Spring 2015 edition of Highway Builder Magazine "When Golden Triangle first presented this concept to Penn DOT, the most important aspect of the potential benefits which caught our attention was safety. Eliminating the "as-designed" rehabilitation to the two mainline bridges carrying Interstate 70 over the ramp to Interstate 79 south allowed several safety improvements that this tunnel afforded. These included a much safer way to construct the tunnel versus rehabilitating the structure; a safer way to set the work zone up to navigate traffic through the interchange area; but most importantly, a much safer way for workers to construct the tunnel.
